This one-day event has students participating in active learning sessions including board games, a budgeting exercise, as well as discussions regarding success, employment and life after high school.

Like other Junior Achievement programs, Economics for Success is curriculum-linked, student centered and skills focused. EFS is delivered during a full school day by trained and inspiring volunteers from the business community. There is no cost to schools for this program. It is funded by local businesses, service clubs and foundations. Volunteers will facilitate the workshop with a presentation partner (usually a work associate), in a grade 8 classroom for one full school day. Guidance, materials and pre-class training (about 2 hours) are provided by Junior Achievement.
